PCYC Queensland is an award-winning charity providing youth and community programs, services and facilities.

Our staff and volunteers have been working with the Queensland Police Service (QPS) to meet local community needs since 1948.

PCYC Queensland provides a safe place for over 70,000 members through our 56 clubs and play a vital role in the lives of more than 50,000 young people each year from the Torres Strait to the Gold Coast and beyond, many of whom are at risk, disadvantaged or disengaged.

Almost 90% of our work is funded through donations and our fee-for-services, and the remaining 10% is through government funding and significant in-kind support from our QPS partners.

Our three pillars of youth development, crime prevention and community engagement underpin all that we do, and our programs and activities encourage social cohesion, address whole of community needs and aim to positively impact local communities.

Together, we are building safer, healthier communities through youth development.
